

Margarita Aznar is PhD in Anal. Chem. She obtained her degree in Chemistry (speciality: Analytical Chemistry) in the University of Zaragoza in 1997. During the last year she carried out as well my master thesis (Mark: First class “Outstanding”), performed in the Analytical Chemistry Department. She obtained her PhD in 2002, supported by a FPI fellowship from the Spanish Ministry of Education and Culture, in the Laboratory of Aroma Analysis and Oenology of the University of Zaragoza (LAAE). Afterwards, she did a postdoctoral research stage of two years (2002-2004) in the Flavour Technology Research Group of the University of Nottingham (UK). This stage was possible thanks to a postdoctoral fellowship from the Spanish Ministry of Education and Culture and a postdoctoral contract from the British Council. In 2005, she started working in the Institute of Rural Development and Food and Agricultural Research of Madrid (IMIDRA), with a doctor INIA contract (postdoctoral contract supported by the National Institute of Agricultural Research). She worked for 3 years (2004-2007) in the Food Research Department. Since January 2008, she is working in the Analytical Research Group (GUIA) of the University of Zaragoza, first as postdoctoral researcher and since 2012 as “Ramon y Cajal” researcher (contract supported by Spanish Ministry of Economy and Competitiveness). She has worked in different research lines in the frame of food packaging from an analytical point of view, such as the identification of compounds present in food packaging materials, the development of analytical methodologies for its quantification and the development of new packaging materials. She also collaborates in the teaching of some subjects of the analytical chemistry area. Her scientific career can be reflected in 22 participations in research projects (3 as main researcher) and 12 in research contracts with companies, 30 scientific publications and 38 presentations in national and international congresses. She has also supervised 2 doctoral theses and several final degree projects.
